#### SAINTS FOR THE DAY

When the Pope spoke to school children at Twickenham a few years ago his message was 'We are called to be Saints'. This term schools in our Diocese are being asked to interpret that message while at the same time supporting the Charity WORK. WORK supports orphans and widows in Africa and was founded by a priest from our diocese. We have decided to combine our efforts with those of our RE adviser, Sarah Adams, who is walking the 60 mile Saints Way through Cornwall for WORK. Our aim is for each class to walk / run 60 miles between them on the morning of June 27th. The whole school will go over to Brickfields to run/ walk our miles. Children can wear their own sportswear for the day (with suitable sun protection). Children will be asked to make a voluntary donation to WORK on the day.
