### SATs

We are very proud of the effort that our year 6 children put into their SAT tests last week. They remained level-headed and focussed throughout the six tests that they had to take. I have heard tales from other schools where not just the children but the teachers were in tears after some of the tests. Thankfully we had no scenes like that and the children enjoyed ice-cream and a trip to the park at the end of the tests. The test papers have been sent off for external marking and we have a long wait now until the results come out in early July.

The children in years 1 & 2 are also facing assessment tasks this term. These will not be in the same high pressure environment that year 6 faced last week. Year 2 will sit papers in maths and reading which will be marked internally and will inform Mrs Spry's overall assessment rather than decide it. Year 1 are used to sitting down with Mrs Way and going through their sounds for phonics and their 'test' day will be just like all of the other times they have done it.

# SPORTS DAY

A meeting has been called for senior staff in all CAST schools to attend. Unfortunately the date clashes with our Sports Day. We have decided to postpone Sports Day so that it will no longer be held on 16<sup>th</sup> June but will instead be on the reserve date of 30<sup>th</sup> June. # Attendance

The attendance percentage of a school is deciding factor in the Ofsted judgement on personal development, behaviour and welfare. Since our inspection earlier this year our overall percentage has slipped below the 96% figure which relates to a 'good' judgement. Many children have a very good attendance record and all of those who were at 99% or above enjoyed a '99 club' ice cream at the end of last term. However 21 children are now in the Persistent Absentee group whose attendance is below 90%. Last year only 1 child finished the year in that group. Later this week all children will take home an
