Free School Meals

Since the introduction of Free School Meals for all children in Year 2 and below we have experienced a fall in the number of families registering their entitlement to Free School Meals. The actual meals are not the only benefit for families who meet the Free School Meal criteria. Once a child is registered for Free School Meals they automatically become entitled to Pupil Premium Funding which lasts for at least six years. At the moment each child attracts an extra £1320 each year. One of the ways we use the Pupil Premium grant is to pay for all school trips (including the PGL residential trip). We also pay for extra teaching hours which are directed particularly towards closing gaps in, or extending, the learning of children who are entitled to pupil premium funding. The amount of money the school will receive under the new national funding formula being proposed by the government is also likely to increase if we have more children registered as being entitled to free school meals. If you meet ANY of the criteria below you can attract this extra funding for your child and the school.

- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Child Tax Credit (most recent award notice with no Working Tax Credit AND annual income not exceeding £16,190
- Guarantee element of pension credit
- Income Related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act

If you do receive any of the above support please ask the office for a Free School Meals form.

Indoor Athletics

Last Thursday twelve children from years 4, 5 & 6 took part in the Catholic Schools Indoor Athletics Championships at Notre Dame School. In the past two years the children have come away with silver medals and they were determined to change that to gold this year. The hard work the children put in during most lunchtimes over the previous two weeks paid off. We were involved in twelve different relay races winning nine of them and coming second in the other three. All of the children also competed individually in throwing, jumping or agility events scoring points for the overall total. At the end of the afternoon we achieved our goal and the children went home very proud of the gold medals around their necks. Winning the event meant that we have qualified to compete against the other eight schools across the city who won their localised events.
