## Worship and Liturgy - Christ the King

As we approach Advent we are reminded In Sunday's Gospel that we need to treat all those

around us well He tells us, "I was hungry and you fed me, thirsty and you gave me a drink; I was a stranger and you received me in your homes, naked and you clothed me; I was sick and you took care of me, in prison and you visited me." When his listeners said they had not done that for Jesus he replied," 'I tell you, whenever you did this for one of the least important of these members of my family, you did it for me!'

#### Anti-Bullying Week

A group of Year 6 children analysed our definition of bullying this week and suggested there should be a slight amendment. Their addition is in capitals . Our new definition is:

Bullying is when somebody is hurt repeatedly over a period of time. The type of hurting can include:

Physical e.g. hitting, taking, BREAKING or hiding things

**Verbal** e.g. teasing, name-calling, threats

**Emotional** e.g. writing unkind things, spreading rumours, playing nasty tricks, nasty looks, making somebody feel left out.

**Cyberbullying** eg sending chain mail, nasty messages by text, email or other, sending messages pretending to be someone else, publishing photos or videos which could cause upset to the victim.

Bullying is deliberate, repetitive and inappropriate
