First Aid

We have decided to increase our level of communication with parents regarding minor injuries requiring First Aid. In the past we have only made formal contact with parents if there has been a head injury or a more serious injury which we have felt you would want to know about immediately. A number of parents have expressed surprise, and disappointment, when a minor injury has occurred at school but they have not been informed. To rectify that situation we are going to introduce a new system where parents will receive an 'Accident, Incident & Illness Report Form' each time that First Aid treatment is given. Parents will be asked to acknowledge receipt of the form by signing an acknowledgement slip and returning it to school. The new system should be up and running after half term.

The children will have an assembly in the morning and then will spend the rest of the morning engaged in e-safety related activities.
