Christmas Party Day

Communication

In the last week there have been three occasions where an adult has come into school at the end of the day saying they have been asked to collect somebody else's child. On each of the occasions it was a genuine request but without direct communication between the parent and the school we cannot be sure that the request is genuine and so we have to then try to contact the parent to be assured that they are happy for us to let their child go with somebody else. If for any reason you want somebody other than the usual people to collect your child please phone the school to let us know.

In some classes valuable time is being lost in the morning because parents want to have a chat with a teacher or teaching assistant when the class go into the building. If you need to pass on a vital piece of information then the morning is an appropriate time to do so, but if you need some kind of response from an adult please try to leave it until the end of the day to have a conversation.

Argyle After School Clubs

We will continue to use funding from the Ministry of Defence to pay for after school clubs run by Plymouth Argyle coaches next term. On Mondays there will be a girls only football club for girls in years 4, 5 & 6. On Fridays we will continue to have a multi sports fitness club for children in years 1 & 2. Preference for places in these clubs will initially be given to children from military families. For the younger children all children can apply but preference will also be given to children who did not take part in the club this term. Children who are interested will be given application forms this week.

Swimming

Children in year 4 will be going swimming every morning for three weeks at the beginning of next term starting on the first day back (Wednesday 4th January). These children will get a separate letter explaining what equipment will be needed each day.
