Mr Dyson

I can't let Mr Dyson's (temporary) departure go by without passing on my personal thanks for everything he has done for he children of St Joseph's (so far). He was a breath of fresh air when he joined us in September 2015. He was integral to our successful Ofsted inspection in 2016 and has continued to drive improvements since then. The children, rightly, see him as the funniest member of the staff but also appreciate improvements to their learning that he has contributed to hugely. He has been a great support to me. I feel he is ready for this step up in his career and he will learn very quickly which can only be to the benefit of our St Joseph's children when he returns.

Attendance

As we approach the end of term we are still just short of our target of 96% attendance. The average for the whole school stands at 95.73% with Class 3 the top attenders with an impressive average of 97.41%. Any child with an attendance figure of less than 90% is classed as a persistent absentee and is likely to be contacted by the Educational Welfare Officer and asked to provide medical evidence for any future absences. Over the course of the year an attendance of 90% would mean that four whole weeks of schooling will have been missed. Research has shown a direct link between high absence and lower achievement in school. We have 27 children in the persistent absentee category, which is more than is expected for a school of our size. Lateness is another barrier to children performing to their ability in school. Fifteen minutes late each day is the same as two full weeks of absence. If you have been regularly late this term please adjust your morning routines so that you can give your children the best chance of doing well in school. On the bright side we have 49 children who have attended school every day this term, well done to all of them. Another 8 have only missed only part of one day. They have received a small reward today to recognise their outstanding attendance.

Sports Clubs

In the first week back in January a number of children who have shown an interest in netball will be invited to stay for netball practice each evening, to be ready for a tournament in the second week back. Invitations to other clubs will go out in that first week so that clubs can start in the week beginning the 14th Jan. During that week, in addition to the netball competition, we will also have a table tennis day with coaching for Years 3,4,5 & 6 and an indoor rowing day for years 5 & 6.

Merry Christmas

Thank you to the children who took the trouble to write cards for staff members. Nearly all of you remembered to use capital letters for names! There will be Mass at St Joseph's Church on Christmas

Eve. Mass will start at 6.00 pm but there will be carol singing starting half an hour earlier. Please have a happy and holy Christmas. We return to school on Monday 7 th January.	,
