and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals. "


Witnesses of Christ - this half term we ask the children to be witnesses of Christ by sharing things equally, praying for solutions to inequality, feeling grateful for what we have.

Cards





Christmas cards to be brought in or sent home this year. The children will get the chance to make a card in school for their classmates. This may be a real card or a self designed e-card. Staff will also not be able to accept gifts from children this year or to give out little treats as many have done for many years. We are suggesting that money that would have been spent on cards and presents could be given to one of the charities we have publicised recently, or one of your own choice. One good choice could be Mary's meals as every pound given to them is doubled by UK Aid. Mary's meals provide school meals in countries where it is difficult for children to go to school. The promise of a meal at school has the double benefit of feeding needy children and allowing them to access education which is key to breaking the cycle of poverty.

Christmas Dinner / Mufti Day

It has been lovely to walk around the school this week and hear children singing Christmas Carols. We will record each class singing and make it available to you. On the 17th December we will do our best to celebrate



Christmas in school with the children. You should have had a text message about ordering Christmas lunch for that day. The children can wear Christmas clothing into school on the 17th. Unfortunately we will not be able to gather together for our traditional Talent Show but fun activities will be taking place in each bubble (or maybe they should be baubles for that day).



PGL

After their September trip was cancelled we had rebooked the year 6 trip to PGL for March but that too has been cancelled. Fortunately we have been able to rebook again for the week beginning 14th June. To go at that time of year would normally cost £139 per child more than the price in September but fortunately we have been able to make this booking at NO EXTRA COST. Fingers crossed that we will be closer to 'normal' by June and the trip will eventually go ahead. If parents could restart making payments towards the trip we will know that we can finance the trip when we get the go ahead. No money will be sent to PGL until we get that go ahead so your money will be safe if the trip is cancelled. However if there is not enough money in the bank to make the payment (in March) we will have to cancel the trip ourselves.

DELT Half Marathon

Traditionally children have been able to run a mile on the Hoe on the same day as the Plymouth Half Marathon after completing 12 miles while at school. This will not happen in 2021 but the half marathon challenge will



still go ahead with all of the miles being completed in school. You can register for the event at <u>runplymouth</u>. Entry costs £8 and each runner who completes their 13miles will get a medal and a drinks bottle. The closing date for entries is Feb 7th. We will allow all children to run the distance in school but only those who officially enter through runplymouth will get a medal and a drink bottle.
