They won the hearts of all of the Raiders staff and improved with every half of each game they played. The cheer when we scored our first basket was the loudest of the day. All ten children battled for the full twenty minutes of each game on the full-size court and I couldn't have been more proud of their 'never-say die' attitude.

#### **Escape Rooms**

You may be aware of the concept of 'Escape Rooms' where teams are faced with unfamiliar situations where they are forced to think creatively and analytically; offer possible solutions; listen to others; learn from failure; and work together to achieve a rescue or escape from the situation they are in. That type of

problem solving fits in very neatly with our vision for how we want children to learn at St Joseph's. Unfortunately escape rooms are relatively expensive and seldom allow primary school children to take part. During the teachers' training day we tried to design situations which would replicate the experience at a level that our children could enjoy. After trialling the rooms we designed, we found they need a few tweaks but soon we hope to be able to see our older children 'solving' these rooms and designing new ones for younger children. Parents might even get a go if you are lucky.
