


<u>Attendance</u>

Next week every child will be getting an attendance letter. This will inform you of your child's attendance to date using a Green, Amber and Red system. Around 36,000 children are being given a packet of wildflower seeds this April to help support pollinating insects in the local area. As we all know, less flowers means less bees and other pollinating insects that are vital for our world. We fully understand that not all children have gardens to grow their seeds; therefore, we would like to grow

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some of the seeds in school to support our gardens and the buzzing insects that live in our grounds.

We will have a team from *Pollinize* come in to work alongside some of our children to reinvigorate some of our allotment area; however, if you have any spare *garden plant pots* that you are willing to donate, please could you kindly bring them to the office in order for our children to GET GROWING!




Lyn McCloughlin - Foundation Governor responsible for Pupil Premium grants
