We have once again achieved a remarkably high percentage of children who reached the desired level in the phonics screening test for Year 1 children. 93% of our children scored at least 32 / 40. Nationally last year 82% of children reached the level. Congratulations to Mrs Shores, Mrs Norton and their team of highly skilled teaching assistants who have supported the children in achieving the very best scores that they could.

## Annual Reports

In line with the practice of many schools we have amended the layout and content of our school reports this year. Instead of detailed accounts of work covered, and progress made, you will get a one word descriptor for your child's **Attitude to Learning, Effort, Progress and Attainment** in each subject that they have been learning in. You will also get a Class Teacher's Comment explaining how your child has grown in their learning and behaviour over the course of the year. Reports will go out on the 12th July. You will have an opportunity to discuss the report with your child's teacher on the following Wednesday 17th July.
