Worship and Liturgy -

In This Sunday's gospel Jesus asks the disciples 'Who do people say I am?' They explain that the people think he is Elijah and

other old Testament prophets. Jesus asks the disciples who do **you** say I am and Peter explains that he knows he is the son of God, Christ. Jesus explains what is going to happen to him, that he is going to die and Peter finds this difficult to accept. Peter feels afraid that Jesus might leave them and he wants to protect Jesus from harm because he cares about him. Jesus tells him that God wants this to happen and we must trust in God.

It is sometimes hard to do what God wants us to do, just like it was for Peter, because we are afraid, and we do not want to get hurt, or for those that we love to be hurt. The gospel ends with Jesus asking everyone to follow him. Jesus tells us that it will not always be easy to follow him, but that we must have courage, because God will always be with us. This week we are asking the children to have the courage to walk in Jesus footsteps, to follow his path and to trust in his ways.

The uniform letter states clearly that plain navy or black shoes must be worn, yet on the website, it says that trainers (plain black) are acceptable.
