Covid Update - It's Not Over Yet

We are eagerly awaiting the announcement about whether the road map of covid release will be complete on

June 21st or if we will face continued restrictions. The number of people needing tests seems to have increased this week and some families have found it harder to get immediate access at a testing centre so the need to be vigilant is still there. It would be great to relieve ourselves of face masks and allow the children to not be restricted to only playing with children from their own class. Selfishly I would like to see the hall full of children singing their hearts out once again before I leave. Also, personally, I am hoping that the Prime Minister will announce the return of headteachers being able to quality control the standard of food provided to the children by sampling chips when they are served. PGL

I had an unexpected phone call from PGL this week saying that they are having to postpone or cancel some booked visits as they expect the Covid restrictions to last beyond June 21st. Fortunately they asked other schools who were due to be at Beam House to change

their arrangements which means that St Joseph's will be the only school at the centre throughout the week beginning July 12th. I am hoping that this will mean that we will have our own choice of activities.
